#### Scholarly Expertise & Research Foci

I am a social and behavioral scientist who examines substance use behaviors and related factors, with specific training and expertise in alcohol use, alcohol-induced impairment, and intoxication. My research spans a variety of content areas associated with the assessment and measurement alcohol-related behaviors, including but not limited to, impaired driving, intoxication, and protective behavioral strategies to minimize intoxication. I also investigate alcohol-related policies and practices, such as selling alcohol at collegiate sporting events and marketing alcohol on digital platforms.
